



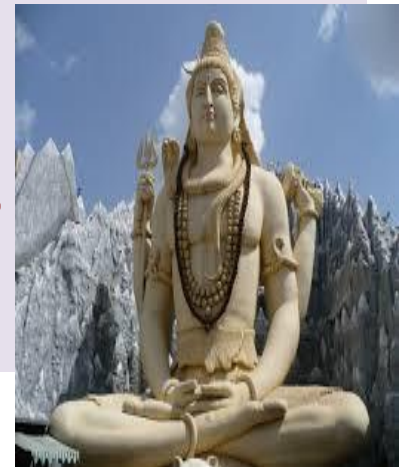
Title: Arguments for the existence of God

LO: To understand and evaluate some reasons that people have for believing or not believing in God

Reminder: A good argument...

- ... is not a lie (i.e. which means 'not true')
- ...has a good explanation that makes sense
- ...provides evidence (i.e. reasons explained in detail, examples from real life, facts etc.)
- ... is the truth in a way that can be applied in the moral world (i.e. helps us chose between right and wrong)
- ...is convincing!

God exists because the beauty and complexity of the world mean that someone has designed it

- Think of a watch. Has someone made it or was it created by chance? Why?



- Think of the world. Has someone made it or was it created by chance? Why?



God exists because the universe cannot come from nothing

- Matter always has a beginning and an end.
- Whereas spirit, by definition is eternal.
- Everything material within our experience has an origin.
- The universe must also have a cause which some people consider to be God.
- God by definition needs no cause as he is spirit and so is eternal.



- **Can you think of something that comes from nothing?**

God exists because people have experienced his presence

- Some people claim that they have had a religious experience such as a miracle, a vision, an out-of-body experience or a prayer to God answered.
- Therefore God exists.



God doesn't exist because a good and powerful God would not allow people to suffer

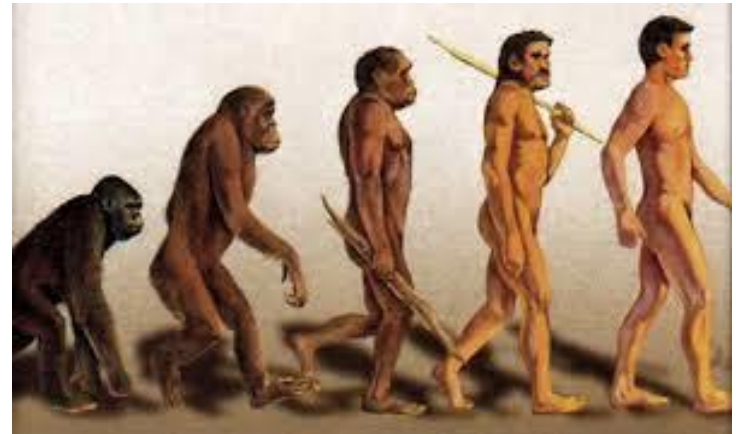
- If God is powerful....
- If God is kind....
- If God knows past, present and future....

...WHY IS THERE SUFFERING IN THE WORLD?



There is no evidence for God's existence...

....but there is evidence that God is NOT the creator (i.e. the big-bang theory and Darwin's theory of evolution)

Is God non-personal?



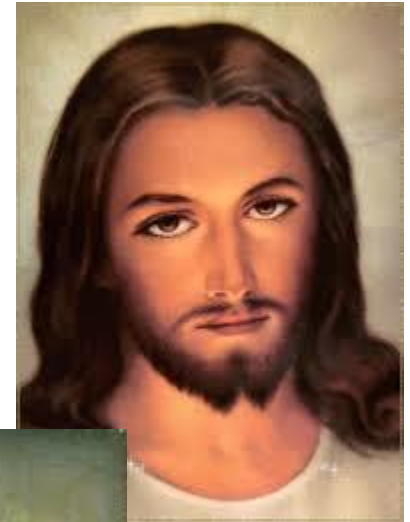
- What do we mean when we say, ‘God is not a person?’
