# Reminder: A good argument...

- ... is not a lie (i.e. which means 'not true')
- ...has a good explanation that makes sense
- ...provides evidence (i.e. reasons explained in detail, examples from real life, facts etc.)
- ... is the truth in a way that can be applied in the moral world (i.e. helps us chose between right and wrong)
- ...is convincing!

## God exists because the universe cannot come from nothing

- Matter always has a beginning and an end.
- Whereas spirit, by definition is eternal.
- Everything material within our experience has an origin.
- The universe must also have a cause which some people consider to be God.
- God by definition needs no cause as he is spirit and so is eternal.

# God exists because people have experienced his presence

 Some people claim that they have had a religious experience such as a miracle, a vision, an out-of-body experience or a prayer to God answered.

Therefore God exists.



## God doesn't exist because a good and powerful God would not allow people to suffer


- If God is powerful....
